My mind continued to consider all the things that I needed to prepare for this upcoming Sunday and for Thanksgiving. I saw my life as a time capsule. The past, present and future as I motored towards New York.

We are celebrating All saints this Sunday, the past. My thoughts rambled through the many people who have gone on or we moved away from that got us to today. We are to remember all the Saints that have graced our lives and helped us to deal with the struggles of life as well as keeping us connected to our faith. There have been many who are now living out eternity with Jesus. Jan, the boys, and I moved south in 1995.

I then thought of all the things that I have to be thankful for. I am not talking about the monetary things but the things that really matter, like family and friends, the things that last. May you remember the things that you have to be thankful for as you prepare for the work that must be done as family and friends prepare to come and celebrate with you at your house.

My thoughts then moved on to the future. I have had to think about getting my house in order. I am not talking about the superficial things, like cleaning my garage, raking leaves, and such. I

am talking about the things that really matter, relationship with Jesus, family, and friends. How have I left things? If I were to leave home today and never return would my kids, my wife, my friends, my family, and my Lord know how I feel about them? Is my house in order enough to meet Jesus face to face? I do not know what tomorrow holds, thank God! I do however know who holds tomorrow.

I drove to New York with the thought of having to say goodbye to my mother, until we meet again in heaven. I had packed my robe, my suit, my Methodist Book of Worship, and my thoughts. Does mom know how much she has meant to me in the past, today and tomorrow? Have I done all I can to foster our relationship. You see, the real treasures in life are not something you can hold in your hand, your bank account, park in your driveway or boat slip, or your retirement fund. The real treasures are how much you love and how much you are loved. The real joy in remembering Saints, giving Thanks, and thinking about tomorrow is LOVE. With great love I write these words to you. Celebrate each other with great exuberance and joy. Nurture your relationships and work to develop new ones. Give thanks for your past, love today, and be prepared spiritually for meeting Jesus when your day comes.

The church clean up was a great success. Thank you to all who helped.

Bob Wilson is heading up a work group whose function is to keep up with maintenance. We want to thank Bob Wilson, John Cox, Charles Jones, Hal Paxton, George Ferguson, Jim Gibbs, Bill Hoofnagle and Jim Ford for volunteering to do this work.

As you may know, we are working with a structural engineer who specializes in old buildings and old churches. His main concern is the roof rafter and ceiling joist construction. It was first thought that a queen post truss system would be constructed between the drop ceiling and the original wood ceiling (there is a 3-1/2 foot space in between). Happily, it now appears that all the corrective structural reinforcements can be done in the attic with no disturbance to the sanctuary ceiling. The engineer has been authorized to proceed with final detailed drawings which the trustees will use to get contractor bids in order to make our roof/ceiling joist system sound.

After we learn the scope of the roof project the trustees and building committee will meet and reorganize to work together on the new fellowship hall.
